Nachiket Mor has a Post Graduate Diploma in Management from the Indian Institute of Management at Ahmedabad and a PhD in Economics from the University of Pennsylvania with a specialisation in Finance from the Wharton School. He is a member of the Boards of Reserve Bank of India, National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development, Micro Units Development and Refinance Agency Limited, and CRISIL. He is a Senior Advisor to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. He is also a member of the Health Commission for the State of Himachal Pradesh in India, and the Task Force on Global Health at the Institute of Medicine in Washington DC. He worked with ICICI from 1987 to 2007 and was a member of its Board of Directors from 2001 to 2007. From 2007 to 2011, he served as the founding President of ICICI Foundation for Inclusive Growth.

Shailaja Chandra was in the IAS for 38 years with 15 years of experience in the Central Government (Defence, Energy and Health sectors) and 23 years in the Delhi Government, Manipur, Goa and the Andaman & Nicobar Administration. She has done her MSc Economics from University of Wales. She was a Fellow at the Institute of Advanced Studies at IAS Nantes (France).
